

Homelessness results from decades of failed policies. At its core, it is a housing crisis driven by a critical shortage of affordable housing in Atlanta. Hope Atlanta works 1-1 with people experiencing or at risk of homelessness. Every person is unique, and there is no one-size-fits-all solution. Case managers help clients envision a clearer path forward — a bridge to self-sufficiency — and walk side by side along a journey to resilience and stability. Affordable housing has a new twist. Three corporate landlords control nearly 11 percent of the single-family homes available for rent in metro Atlanta's core counties, according to a 2024-2025 analysis led by Taylor Shelton, a geographer at Georgia State University.

Who We Serve

In 2025, Hope Atlanta served a total of 6,546 clients :

- 35% are families with children
- 35% are veterans
- 292 clients received behavioral health services
- 33% are under the age of 18


